CREATIVE IDEAS WORKED EXAMPLE

Theme:	God made a good world	
Passage:	Genesis 1	
Needless to say, much depends on your age group but you get the idea		
Game:	Animal, vegetable, mineral in teams, asking one question at a time	
Prize for game:	Mars/Milky Way/Galaxy	
Icebreaker:	Sharing favourite animal (and why?), landscape etc.	
Quiz:	Amazing facts about created world from internet	
Small groups:	Thought shower as many fish/birds/animals as you can and see which group can think of most.	
Secular song:	'What a wonderful world' by Louis Armstrong (Armstrong, 1967) ¹	
TV/movie clip:	Any wildlife documentary but check it isn't a lion tearing an antelope's head off! If you're that way inclined, why not try making up your own video to go with 'What a wonderful world'.	
Reading:	Intersperse reading with amazing facts about light, stars etc.	
Talk:	In park using torch for light, take seeds with you, and if you can find a sheep! A pantomime horse may be distracting?

Christian songs:	'Indescribable' (Tomlin); 'When all around is fading (Whole world in his hands)' (Hughes)
Prayer:	Pass stone round, as you hold it say, "Thanks God for"

Art:	Draw/paint a picture of something in creation saying 'God saw that it was good' on it.
Craft:	Make a collage of the earth with wildlife pictures
Memory verse:	Gen 1:31a "God saw all that he had made, and it was very good."

memory verse:	Mime
To take home:	A sunflower to grow
Other ideas:	Travel posters (ask at the travel agent!), Bonsai tree or go for broke with a full-size tree and water feature in church (but be aware, I once used a baptistery pump to create such a thing, complete with drainpipe with holes drilled in it for full rain effect.
