


Character 2	Costume idea	Staging idea
High Priest	Long black robe	Front of church. Table with 15 identical coins in a pile. Use the largest ones you have or print your own large cardboard coins. You will need coin puzzle on p.2 below.

Note the young people can ask you for clues whenever they like - it won't be fun if they can't make any progress.

Read script (below)

"I'm way too busy to chat to you, how did you even find this house?! My friend gave me a challenge with this money. If you can solve it, I'll tell you all you need to know."




- Answer is **1, 4, 9**
- As long as they physically do the puzzle, they can get the answer.
- When they get it correct say 'well done 'and read next part of script.

Read script (below)

"Alright, alright. We bribed Judas with 30 silver coins to tell us where Jesus was. It was all Caiaphas' idea in the first place - he knew Judas was easily bribed. Jesus headed to the temple market after entering Jerusalem, I'd head there next if I were you."

- Encourage them to look at their map
- To move on they must indicate the **Orange dot in 4,1.**
- This one should be pretty easy to find, as long as they realise the temple is the big rectangle at the bottom of the map!
- Send them to Regus the Grocer



**I line up 15 coins so that they are all showing heads.
I go down the line turning over every coin.
Then I go down the line turning over every second coin.
Then I go down the line turning over every third coin.
Then I go down the line turning over every fourth coin.
Then I go down the line turning over every fifth coin.
And so on ...
Until I go down the line turning over the fifteenth coin.
Which coins will end up showing tails?**

Character 5	Costume idea	Staging idea
Gardener	Messy clothes and wellies.	If you've got a little garden, you could clear a patch of soil and mark out the grid with string. Go wild and use real red flowers. Otherwise red card flower heads on sticks will work (watch your risk assessment). Provide soap and towels. An easier alternative: draw and cut out card flowers, mark out the grid anywhere in the church and do the task like that.

Note the young people can ask you for clues whenever they like - it won't be fun if they can't make any progress.

Read script (below)

“ ‘Ello! Y’alright over there? I’ve had the worst day tryin’ to get this flower bed right. Oh... You want the scoop on Jesus. Well he was here praying with his friends, I’ll be honest he looked real distraught, when about 20 guards came along and trampled all over my hard work. Can you help me replant this?”



- There are lots of right answers to this puzzle, just make sure they have 18 flowers with an even number in each row and column then progress

forward. Make sure people know what even means - they don't have to all be the same.

- Here's one possible solution below (where X indicates a flower), fill in some of the gaps at a time helping them until they get it.

Read script (below) - after completing the puzzle

“Thank you so much! You're very good, though I s'pose you 'ave to be to be journalists. I've told you all I know but if you want to know where to look next, the people you want to chat to are the Sanhedrin, they're at the trial that's just finished - I hope journalists are clever enough to know where that is but if not, the colour of the flowers will help you.”

- Encourage them to look at their map.
- To move on they must indicate the **Red dot in 4,4**.
- Say the colour of the flowers could help you twice.
- Point out the flowers are red - they might notice there's a red area on the map of the Palace and Praetorium, and there's a red dot in the red area.
- Send them to the Scribe of the Sanhedrin.
